

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Our Programs

Brighter Futures

As the digital age continues to evolve and shape the world around us, cybercrime has become an increasingly prevalent issue that affects people of all ages and backgrounds. In Nigeria, this problem is particularly acute among the youth population, where many are lured into engaging in criminal activities online due to a lack of opportunities and awareness of the risks involved.

At CYSIED, we believe that young people have the potential to be a force for positive change in their communities. That's why we were thrilled to partner with TAG International (Torchlight and Axiom Group), a UK-based organization that shares our vision of creating a safer and more secure online environment for all.

Together, we implemented a youth-driven intervention program aimed at reducing the involvement of young people in cybercrime activities in Nigeria. The project was conducted for 2 weekends in two (2) local governments (Ikorodu and Ajeromi-Ifelodun) in Lagos state, Nigeria, featuring a sensitization campaign on the first day and a CaptureTheFlag competition on the second day.

The sensitization campaign was aimed to raise awareness of the dangers of cybercrime while


promoting alternative pathways for young people. We had experts from the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) engage with our target audience between the ages of 15-30 numbering 110, sharing information and insights about the risks of engaging in cybercrime and the potential consequences of these actions. We also had Yusuf Augustine (Cybersecurity Expert) emphasize the importance of digital literacy while encouraging the participants to explore legitimate opportunities in the technology industry.

On the second day of the program, we organized a CaptureTheFlag competition that provided an opportunity for young people to showcase their skills and knowledge in a fun and engaging way. By presenting cybersecurity challenges that required critical thinking and problem-solving, we were able to foster an interest in cybersecurity among the participants and promote positive behavior.

The success of this program would not have been possible without the commitment and dedication of our team at Diary of Hackers, as well as the support from TAG International. We are proud to have contributed to the fight against cybercrime and empower the youth to become agents of change in their communities.

cybersecurity workshop for Business Owners underscored the critical need to safeguard businesses from cyber threats.

With over 200 volunteers in 11 states, our Sabi Cyber Movement reached far and wide, from Abuja and Lagos to Oyo, Ondo, Kwara, Akwa-Ibom, and beyond Nigeria's borders to

Kenya and Ghana. We engaged with 21 schools, 5 organizations, and local businesses, visited 4 radio stations, 4 religious centers, conducted 2 rallies, and participated in 1 NYSC Community Development Program. Social media played a crucial role in spreading awareness and reaching numerous individuals in these locations.

Adding to the impact, we hosted the first-ever national Cybersecurity Essay Competition, open to Secondary and Tertiary School Students across Nigeria. The primary goal was to engage participants in critical thinking about cybersecurity and digital safety. Winners were rewarded with cash prizes.

Beyond imparting knowledge, our focus was on making people aware of the challenges in the digital world and how to stay safe online. These moments were invaluable, underscoring our commitment to creating a safe and secure Nigeria. It's not just an adventure; it's our mission, the essence of CYSED.

Sabi Cyber is an annual cybersecurity campaign executed in October during the 'National Cyber Security Awareness Month' (NCSAM). The term "Sabi," derived from Nigerian Pidgin English, translates to "to know" or "to be knowledgeable," perfectly encapsulating the essence of #SabiCyber as an initiative promoting cybersecurity knowledge—an essential aspect of being well-informed. Originating in 2021 from Diary Of Hackers, the flagship community of The Cybersecurity Education Initiative (CYSED), #SabiCyber has evolved into a more significant cybersecurity awareness movement.

This year's Sabi Cyber Movement marked a remarkable chapter as CYSED embarked on an extensive adventure spanning across Nigeria. Our mission was unequivocal: to ensure that every Nigerian is informed about cybersecurity and aware of online dangers. Workshops were conducted for State Ministries, Departments, and Agencies in Niger State, as well as Federal Government MDAs in Abuja. Various speakers addressed the events, and exercises were provided to enhance their security knowledge. Additionally, a virtual

Putting the attendees on the verge of excitement was the live hacking demo with Olufela Osideko where she demonstrated a Business Logic Vulnerability. The attendees were given a glimpse of some career options and paths in the breakout session with Oluwatosin (Tosin) Fatokun (GRC), Oluwaseyi Ajadi (Devsecops), Adamu Usman (ethical hacking), and Sulaiman Gbadamosi (BlueTeam).

There was a capture-the-flag hacking competition during the conference where winners were awarded cash and other prizes. Other sessions like the games and presentation of awards to our CTF players and social media flex, added more fun to the mix.

During the event, we launched our umbrella organization Cybersecurity Education Initiative which is a youth-led non-profit organization on a mission to combat cybercrime in a sustainable and innovative way.

The lecture which was co-hosted by the Aig-Imoukhuede Foundation's Executive Vice-Chair, Ofovwe Aig-Imoukhuede, and the British High Commissioner, Richard Montgomery featured Professor Stefan Dercon of the Blavatnik School of Government, University of Oxford.

Mr. Aig-Imoukhuede restated the definition of an elite as "a person who excels in any field or industry."
